



## **92nd Anniversary Gallery Match Program March 12-13, 2022**

**Prep Schools will be specially scheduled to accommodate their season rules**

Welcome! This is arguably the longest running and the largest indoor continuous rifle match in the United States. The Match Director fired in it for the first time in 1957 when it was held at the Winchester Club House in New Haven. Old-timers will remember the X, Y and Z ranges and shooting off tables. Competitors exceeded 1,000 over the two week-end tournament.

This match proves that the shooting sports are for all ages as the participation age ranges from 9 to 90. Awards are based on the Lewis Class system.

Merit Medals will be awarded to all competitors firing in the Sub-Junior and Junior portions of the match regardless of their fired score—Gold for Juniors & Silver for Sub-Juniors. Remember that a Sub-Junior can shoot in the Junior and Senior matches and a Junior can shoot in the Senior match.

If you are shooting on a team, coach must register for dates/relay times for all individuals in order to eliminate confusion on members of a team and/or number of communiques to match directors.

**Relay Times:** 0900 until 1700 starting on the hour every hour. Please arrive no later than one hour before your relay in order to give yourself plenty of time to register and set-up!

**Entry Fee:** Make checks payable to **Quaker Hill Rod and Gun Club**

Each Individual Match: \$20 The team fee is included if all members are firing the individual match. A team card with the name of all members must be entered before the first team member fires a shot.

**Rules:** NRA Small-bore Rifle Rules will govern. No pick-up teams allowed.

**Time limit:** 33 minutes

**Scoring:** Orion scoring system—Scores will be available within an hour. They may be viewed by visiting.

**Course of Fire:**

Sub-Juniors: 20 Shots Prone, Iron Sights (coaching allowed)

Juniors: 5 shots each Prone, Sitting, Kneeling & Standing Iron Sights (coaching allowed)

Seniors: 5 shots each Prone, Sitting, Kneeling & Standing Any Sights (no coaching allowed)

Reminder that Sub-Juniors can fire in the Junior and Senior Matches, and Juniors can fire in the Senior Match

**Awards Schedule**

Senior Individuals-Match Winner, High Out-of-State, High Connecticut Senior (55+), First, Second and Third in each Lewis class.

Junior Individuals-Match Winner, First, Second and Third in each Lewis class.

Sub-Junior Individuals-Match Winner, First, Second and Third in each Lewis class.

Sub-Junior, Junior and Senior Teams-Match Winner, First, Second and Third in each Lewis class

The Lewis Class System divides each category into classes. Suppose there are 50 senior shooters. A division will be made into 10 classes: A, B, C, D, E. The top three shooters in Class A will receive first, second and third place Class A award. The Junior and Sub-juniors' categories will be divided in a likewise manner.

Range Accommodations: Eye and hearing protection are required. The Club can provide mats, shooting stands, spotting scopes and eye and hearing protection to anyone who needs them. The range has eight points, and each point will have a target hanger which can accommodate four targets and their backers. A direct entrance to the range is available behind the club house. This will only be available when relays change. This will relieve shooters of having to carry their gear down a flight of stairs.

The Snack Bar will be open and sell hamburgers, hot dogs, chips, and soda at a fair price.

Directions: The club is located at 261 Oxoboxo Dam Road, Oakdale, CT 06370. Take exit 79 off I-395 north or south. Turn right onto Rt. 163. Follow Rt. 163 for 3.5 miles. Turn left onto Oxoboxo Dam Road. Club is 2 mile on right. There is a sign at the entrance. Alternate directions are available if you search "driving directions" on the internet.
